From a prime mover and shaker in the US abortion rights movement, Dr Bernard

Nathanson embarked on a spiritual journey of redemption.

Professor Sir William Liley, co-founder of the pro-life cause in New Zealand, pioneered blood transfusions for babies still in the womb and greatly advanced the understanding of foetal development. His research had a profound effect on Dr Bernard Nathanson's conversion through his scientific evidence that the preborn baby was a developing human person from conception.

Dr Nathanson ran the world's largest abortion clinic in New York for five years in the 1970s. Exhausted by the workload, he took a sabbatical during which he read Sir Professor Liley's research. The scales fell from his eyes, as he wrote in a bombshell open letter to the US Medical Association:

"I have personally taken part in the killing of 16,000 human beings."

In 1982, the first of four visits to New Zealand, Dr Nathanson flew from New York to meet his "hero" Prof. Sir William Liley. He then devoted the rest of his life unsparingly to the pro-life cause.

His spiritual journey took him from atheistic secular humanism and abortion rights, to a deep Christian faith and redemption.
